Incubatorul de povești colorate/1st edition

We organized between March 22 - 24, 2019, at the National Museum of Romanian Literature, a creative workshop for 22 writers and illustrators. The workshop was held by Michel Van Zeveren, a well-known writer and illustrator of children's books from Belgium.

We also hosted a discussion panel on writing children's picture books, where we invited leading educators and publishers.

Following the workshop, we organized a contest, and the award-winning book, *Ce surpriză!*, by Simona Epure & Georgiana Chiţac, was published by *Cartea Copiilor*.

We donated 1000 copies to kindergartens and libraries from OvidiuRo's network, where teachers carried out literacy activities based on a toolkit designed by CUAC.

Partners: Ovidiu Ro, Reading Together Romania, Cartea Copiilor Publishing House, National Museum of Romanian Literature.

Key figures

- writers and illustrators participated in the creative workshop.
- **1.000** copies of *Ce surpriză!* were donated to kindergartens & libraries from OvidiuRo's network.
 - 1 literacy toolkit based on the book available on our website.
 - training sessions with teachers & librarians who received the book.
- 15.000* children discovered *Ce surpriză!* through reading-aloud and literacy activities.



The New Storytellers/2nd edition/August 2019

The New Storytellers is a diverse children's literature project that showcases the Roma community in Romania.

We are working with Florin Bica (writer) and Anca Smărăndache (illustrator) for the second edition.

They created a picture book, *Nanata*, for children between 3 and 7 years old. The book will be released in May 2020, in partnership with *Cartea Copiilor* Publishing House.

We will donate 500 copies to kindergartens from OvidiuRo's network, along with a literacy & diversity toolkit. Teachers will use the book and the toolkit for at least 2 class sessions.

Partners: OvidiuRo and *Cartea Copiilor* Publishing House The project is funded through a donation from Alex Fund and a fundraising campaign (Swimathon Bucharest 2019).

Key figures

- 1 picture book with Roma characters, for children between 3 7 years.
- 500 copies of book will be donated to kindergartens from OvidiuRo's network.
 - 1 literacy & diversity toolkit based on the book available on our website.
 - 3 training sessions with educators who will receive the book.
- **7.500*** children will discovered *Nanata*, through literacy & diversity activities.

Serious Fun / September 2019

Children from vulnerable backgrounds usually enter primary school with a learning skills gap, especially if they have not attended kindergarten. As a result, many of them do not learn to read and write on time. After a critical initial period, this gap grows rapidly as children fall behind and lose self-confidence and interest in school.

That is why we developed Serious fun, a literacy program based on picture books, for students with reading and writing difficulties in grades 2 - 4. Our goal is to bring them to the class's level in as short a time as possible.

The program is based on two main pedagogical approaches:

- <u>teaching at the right level</u> a simple concept that has been implemented in multiple disadvantaged communities in various countries with similar rates of illiteracy (India, Kenya etc.). It consists of creating groups of a similar level, regardless of the students' age and class, while using class content adapted to the children's level.
- collaborative pedagogy, an educational design that aims to create group communities where children learn and develop by working together

We are currently in the pilot phase.

Partners: Primary School of Ciorogârla, Ciorogârla Town Hall The project is funded through private sponsorship.

Key figures

- 2 modules of literacy activities designed by CUAC, on 2 competence levels. The activities are based on picture books and are aligned to the national curriculum for literacy.
- 15 students, in 2 level groups, participate in activities, 3 times a week, throughout the school year 2019-2020.

200 hours of literacy activities, per group.



All I Know About Us/September 2019

All I Know About Us is a diversity education module for students in grades 3 - 4 and 5 - 7, inspired by <u>Teaching Tolerance</u> and based on the curriculum developed by Julie Olsen Edwards and Louise Derman-Sparks (*Anti-bias Education for Young Children and Ourselves*).

Students explore essential questions about identity, diversity, justice, and social action through a series of 14 lessons. Most of the lessons are based on children's picture books, and the activities are designed to encourage students' engagement while building literacy *and* socio-emotional skills.

We are currently in the pilot phase and working in partnership with Teach for Romania.

Key figures

- 2 modules of 14 lessons, on 2 levels. Comprehensive guidelines for educators accompany each module.
- y teachers implement the program throughout the 2019-2020 school year.
- 200 students enrolled in the program.
- **1,600** picture books donated to the children enrolled in the program.



EVENTS & ACTIONS

Roma Library for Children April 11, 2019

CUAC was invited to the discussion panel "Roma Culture & Children's Literature, Literacy and Empowerment" moderated by Arina Stoenescu, editor at pionier press/Sweden. The panel marked three years since the foundation of the Roma Library for Children at the Roma Culture Museum in Giulești.

Romanian Writers' Union Award June 2019

The Story of the Lost Kendama*, by Adina Rosetti & Irina Dobrescu, was awarded at the Romanian Writers 'Union Awards Gala/Children's and youth literature section.

Reading-aloud event with Adina Rosetti July 10, 2019

We organized a reading-aloud event with Adina Rosetti at the Policy Center for Roma & Minorities for the children involved in the creation of *The Story of the Lost Kendama*.

Caravana Nesupuselor July 2019

Through a partnership with De basm (a local writers' association) & Arthur Publishing House, *The Story of the Lost Kendama* reached 9 libraries from disadvantaged areas.

*The Story of the Lost Kendama was published in the first edition of the New Storytellers project by Arthur Publishing House. We donated 500 copies to Teach for Romania, along with an educational toolkit.



EVENTS & ACTIONS

Little Lit, Children's Literature Festival September 2019

Through a partnership with De basm (a local writers' association), we organized 2 reading workshops for students in grades 3 - 5 from School no. 134, Ferentari, and School no. 1 Sfinții Voievozi/Bucharest.

Invited writers: Sânziana Popescu and Andreea Iatagan.

Reading Diary December 15, 2019

Our friends from *Trambulina de citit* (a platform for promoting children's books) prepared a creative workshop for the children enrolled in our literacy program. Together they created reading diaries & bookmarks with their favorite story character.


Illustration workshop December 21, 2019
